

## Scoil na gCailini Phone Policy for Staff & Pupils

Mindful of the duties and responsibilities assigned to staff in working with children, it is vital that staff be engaged with children at all working times. In this context, access to phones should be limited to **urgency** only.

## **Work Calls**

- Calls to parents/guardians should be kept as short as possible. Where a lengthy conversation with parents/guardians is required, appointments should be made to meet parents or phone them after school.
- Calls to other professionals and organisations should be make in consultation with the Principal and classroom supervision will be arranged where appropriate

## **Personal Calls**

- In general, personal calls should be carried out during break time
- In cases of urgency, a staff member should use discretion in making calls.
- Incoming personal calls should be reserved for urgent matters.

## **Mobile Phones**

- Mobile phones shall be on silent during the working day unless an urgent message/ call is expected.
- Mobile phones may be turned on during break and lunch time
- In case of urgency, staff should use discretion in making calls
- Texting shall follow the rules in relation to calls
- Incoming Notifications from text messages and social media shall be muted.
- Accessing Facebook, Snapchat ,Instagram, Messenger, Whatsapp, Twitter ,
  Pinterest and Youtube is <u>strictly prohibited</u> on <u>mobile phones</u> during
  teaching and learning times except for educational purposes. This also includes
  during Homework club and while on educational outings, school tours and during
  swimming lessons where staff are responsible for all pupils' welfare and learning.
- Staff shall exercise **professional judgement** when posting personal data, images or text to their social media accounts.
- Important Staff messages may be sent via Whatapp during the school day.

Children's Phones - During COVID 19 pandemic the school operates a no phone policy for pupils - until further notice

- Generally, children are not permitted from bringing mobile phones to school. If, at the request of parents, a child takes a mobile phone to school, it must be switched off and handed up to the secretary as soon as the child enters the school. Children in 2nd, 3rd and 4th class are not permitted to have a phone to school.
- The secretary returns the mobile phone to the child at home time
- Pupils in 5th / 6th who are obliged to carry a mobile phone must have a
  permission note from their parents and they must switch it off on entering the
  school grounds in the morning.
- Pupils are forbidden to switch their phone back on until they leave the school grounds after school
- Pupils who ignore this policy and are found with their phones switched on will be dealt with according to the Code of Behaviour
- If a teacher or staff member has a suspicion that a mobile phone has unsuitable
  material stored on it, the pupil will be asked to hand over the phone to the
  teacher or the school principal. The child's parents will be contacted and will have
  to collect the phone from the school
- Where there is evidence that the material on the phone may provide evidence relating to a criminal offence, the phone will be handed over to the Gardaí for further investigation and the parents will be informed
- The school accepts no responsibility for replacing lost, stolen or damaged mobile phones
- Pupils should mark their phones clearly with their name
- Mobile phones which are found in the school without a name must be handed to a member of staff immediately
- It is strongly advised that pupils have passwords/pin numbers to ensure that unauthorised phone calls cannot be made from their phones. These pins and passwords must be kept confidential
- Pupils who use mobile phones to bully other pupils or to send offensive messages or to make offensive calls will face disciplinary actions as per the school's Code of Behaviour
- The same applies to pupils who take unauthorised photos or recordings of other students or staff members
- Watches with camera functions are not permitted in school.
- It is a criminal offence to use a mobile phone to menace, harass or offend another person. As such, if action as sanctioned by the school in this regard is ineffective, as with all incidents, the school may consider it necessary to involve the Gardaí.
